Dear Judge Madrid:

The Office of the Attorney General (“OAG”) received a citizen complaint, pursuant to section 411.209 of the Government Code, concerning the wrongful exclusion of handgun license holders from the Kleberg County Courthouse (the “courthouse”), located at 700 East Kleberg Avenue, Kingsville, Texas 78363. By correspondence dated April 29, 2016, we notified Kleberg County (the “county”) of our determination that a violation of section 411.209 had occurred and that the county had fifteen days to either cure the violation and come into compliance or submit detailed information explaining why the county was not in violation.

By correspondence dated May 9, 2016, the county informed the OAG that the signs forming the basis of the complaint had been removed from the entrances to the courthouse. Based on this representation, we conclude the county is now in compliance with section 411.209 of the Government Code and the relevant provisions of the Penal Code. Accordingly, the OAG is closing this complaint.
