Dear Ms. Villarreal:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 342460 (LGL-09-071).

The City of Waco (the "city") received a request for information pertaining to a specified incident. You claim that a portion of the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. Section 552.101 encompasses information protected by other statutes, such as section 772.318 of the Health and Safety Code. You contend that the originating telephone number of the 9-1-1 caller is excepted under section 552.101 in conjunction with section 772.318. Chapter 772 of the Health and Safety Code relates to local emergency communications districts. Section 772.318 applies to an emergency 9-1-1 district established in accordance with chapter 772 and makes confidential the originating telephone numbers and addresses of 9-1-1 callers that are furnished by a service supplier. *See* Open Records Decision No. 649 (1996). We understand that the city is part of an emergency

communication district that was established under section 772.318.¹ Therefore, to the extent the originating telephone number of the 9-1-1 caller was supplied by a 9-1-1 service supplier, the telephone number you have high lighted in pink within the submitted CAD record is confidential under section 772.318 of the Health and Safety Code and must be withheld from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. To the extent the telephone number you have high lighted was not provided by a 9-1-1 service supplier to the emergency communication district, this information may not be withheld under section 552.101 in conjunction with section 772.318. The remaining submitted information must be released.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
