Dear Ms. Presley:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 511365.

The Frisco Police Department (the "department") received a request for audio and video recordings related to the requestor's arrest on a specified date. You state you will release some of the requested information to the requestor. You claim that the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.130 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Initially, you state portions of the submitted information are non-responsive to the present request because they refer to another individual's license plate and driver's license numbers. However, we note the submitted information consists of the requested audio and video recordings. Therefore, we find the entirety of the submitted information is responsive to the instant request, and we will address your argument against its disclosure.

Section 552.130 of the Government Code provides information relating to a motor vehicle operator's or driver's license or permit, a motor vehicle title or registration, or a personal identification document issued by an agency of Texas or another state or country is excepted from public release. Gov't Code § 552.130(a). Upon review, we find the audio and video portions of the submitted video recordings contain information subject to section 552.130. The audio portions of the recordings are intertwined with the video portions of the

recordings. You state the department does not have the technological capability to redact the motor vehicle record information from the recordings. Accordingly, the department must withhold the submitted recordings in their entirety under section 552.130.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
