Dear Ms. Kimeu:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 519549 (ORU No. 14-0479).

The Houston Police Department (the "department") received a request for all information pertaining to complaints made against department officers by a named individual. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. Section 552.101 encompasses section 143.1214 of the Local Government Code. You state the City of Houston is a civil service city under chapter 143 of the Local Government Code. Section 143.1214 provides in relevant part:

(b) The department shall maintain an investigatory file that relates to a disciplinary action against a fire fighter or police officer that was overturned on appeal, or any document in the possession of the department that relates to a charge of misconduct against a fire fighter or police officer, regardless of whether the charge is sustained, only in a file created by the department for

the department's use. The department may only release information in those investigatory files or documents relating to a charge of misconduct:

- (1) to another law enforcement agency or fire department;
- (2) to the office of a district or United States attorney; or
- (3) in accordance with Subsection (c).

(c) The department head or the department head's designee may forward a document that relates to disciplinary action against a fire fighter or police officer to the director or the director's designee for inclusion in the fire fighter's or police officer's personnel file maintained under Sections 143.089(a)-(f) only if:

- (1) disciplinary action was actually taken against the fire fighter or police officer;
- (2) the document shows the disciplinary action taken; and
- (3) the document includes at least a brief summary of the facts on which the disciplinary action was based.

Local Gov't Code § 143.1214(b)-(c). You inform us the information in Exhibits 2 and 3 is maintained in the department's investigatory files and is not part of the police officers' civil service personnel files. You explain the information at issue consists of records of internal investigations of alleged misconduct on the part of the department police officers. You state Exhibit 2 consists of seven internal affairs investigations of alleged misconduct, which did not result in disciplinary action. You inform us Exhibit 3 pertains to two internal affairs investigations where the allegations resulted in the officers receiving supervisory interventions. You assert this information does not meet the requirements of section 143.1214(c) for inclusion in the police officers' civil service personnel files. *See id.* § 143.1214(c); *see also id.* § 143.089(a)-(g). You state the requestor is not a representative of another law enforcement agency, a fire department, or the office of a district or United States attorney. *See id.* § 143.1214(b)(1)-(2). Based on your representations and our review, we conclude the department must withhold Exhibits 2 and 3 under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 143.1214 of the Local Government Code.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
