Dear Ms. Rodriguez:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 524362.

The Temple Police Department (the "department") received a request for nine categories of information pertaining to a specified traffic citation issued to the requestor. You state the department will release some information to the requestor. You also state the department has no information responsive to portions of the request.¹ You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.108 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information. We have also considered comments submitted by the requestor. *See* Gov't Code § 552.304 (interested party may submit comments stating why information should or should not be released).

Initially, we note you have submitted a copy of the citation at issue and information pertaining to the equipment in the vehicle operated by the officer at the time of the citation. Although you state you have submitted a representative sample of information, we find the submitted information is not representative of all the information sought in the request for

information. Please be advised this ruling applies to only the types of information you have submitted for our review. Therefore, this ruling does not authorize the withholding of any other requested records to the extent those records contain substantially different types of information than that submitted to this office. *See id.* § 552.302 (where request for attorney general decision does not comply with requirements of section 552.301, information at issue is presumed public). To the extent any information responsive to the remaining items in the request existed and was maintained by the department on the date the department received the request for information, we assume the department has released it. If the department has not released any such information, it must do so at this time. *See id.* §§ 552.301-.302; *see also* Open Records Decision No. 664 (2000) (if governmental body concludes no exceptions apply to requested information, it must release information as soon as possible).

Section 552.108(a)(1) of the Government Code excepts from disclosure “[i]nformation held by a law enforcement agency or prosecutor that deals with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime . . . if . . . release of the information would interfere with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime[.]” Gov’t Code § 552.108(a)(1). A governmental body claiming section 552.108(a)(1) must reasonably explain how and why release of the information at issue would interfere with law enforcement. *See id.* §§ 552.108(a)(1), .301(e)(1)(A); *see also Ex parte Pruitt*, 551 S.W.2d 706 (Tex. 1977). We note the information you seek to withhold under section 552.108(a)(1) includes a copy of a citation. Because a copy of the citation was provided to the individual who was cited, we find release of the citation will not interfere with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime. *See* Gov’t Code § 552.108(a)(1). Thus, the department may not withhold the citation we have marked under section 552.108(a)(1). You state the remaining information relates to a pending criminal case and the department objects to the release of this information because its release would interfere with the pending investigation and prosecution. *See Houston Chronicle Publ’g Co. v. City of Houston*, 531 S.W.2d 177 (Tex. Civ. App.—Houston [14th Dist.] 1975) (delineating law enforcement interests present in active cases), *writ ref’d n.r.e. per curiam*, 536 S.W.2d 559 (Tex. 1976). Thus, we find section 552.108(a)(1) is applicable to the remaining information. Therefore, with the exception of the marked citation, which must be released, the department may withhold the submitted information pursuant to section 552.108(a)(1) of the Government Code.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
