Dear Ms. Constantine:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 525382.

The Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport Board (the "board") received a request for a copy of a specified incident report. The board released most of the information responsive to the request. However, the board redacted information it determined to be subject to sections 552.130 and 552.136 of the Government Code without requesting a decision from this office.<sup>1</sup> See Gov't Code §§ 552.130(c), .136(c). Pursuant to sections 552.130(d) and 552.136(d), the requestor has asked this office to review the information and render a decision as to whether this information is excepted from disclosure under the Act. We have considered the exceptions and reviewed the information.

Section 552.130 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure information relating to a motor vehicle operator's or driver's license or permit, a motor vehicle title or registration, or a personal identification document issued by an agency of this state or another state or country. *Id.* § 552.130(a). You state the board will release the requestor's driver's license information to him. See *id.* § 552.023(a), (b) (individual has special right of access to information that relates to himself and is protected by laws intended to protect his privacy interests, and governmental body may not deny access on ground that information is considered confidential by privacy principles). Accordingly, with the exception of the

information you state the board will release, the board must withhold the information you redacted and the additional information we marked under section 552.130 of the Government Code.


Section 552.136(b) of the Government Code provides, “[n]otwithstanding any other provision of [the Act], a credit card, debit card, charge card, or access device number that is collected, assembled, or maintained by or for a governmental body is confidential.” *Id.* § 552.136(b); *see id.* § 552.136(a) (defining “access device”). This office has concluded insurance policy numbers constitute access device numbers for purposes of section 552.136. Accordingly, the board must withhold the insurance policy numbers you redacted under section 552.136 of the Government Code.

In summary, with the exception of the driver’s license information the board will release, the board must withhold the information you redacted and the additional information we marked under section 552.130 of the Government Code. The board must withhold the insurance policy numbers you redacted under section 552.136 of the Government Code.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
