Dear Ms. Quinn:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 526210 (Reference No. 14-446).

The Cedar Park Police Department (the "department") received a request for the entire investigation file related to a specified automotive accident. You state the department has released some responsive information to the requestor. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.130 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.130 of the Government Code provides information relating to a motor vehicle operator's or driver's license or permit, a motor vehicle title or registration, or a personal identification document issued by an agency of Texas or another state or country is excepted from public release. Gov't Code § 552.130(a). You claim the video recordings you have indicated must be withheld under section 552.130 of the Government Code. Upon review, we find the audio and video portions of the video recordings we have indicated contain information subject to section 552.130. The audio portions of the recordings are intertwined with the video portions of the recordings. You state the department lacks the technological capability to redact the confidential information in the video recordings. Accordingly, the department must withhold the video recordings we have indicated in their entirety under section 552.130. *See* Open Records Decision No. 364 (1983). However, we find the remaining video recordings do not contain any discernible information that is subject to

section 552.130. As such, the department may not withhold the remaining video recordings on that basis. As you raise no further exceptions to disclosure, the department must release the remaining video recordings.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
