Dear Ms. Mares:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 557034 (McKinney Reference No. 10-12868).

The City of McKinney (the "city"), which you represent, received a request for information pertaining to a specified incident. You state you have released some information. You claim the submitted video recordings are excepted from disclosure under section 552.130 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.130 of the Government Code provides information relating to a motor vehicle operator's or driver's license or permit, a motor vehicle title or registration, or a personal identification document issued by an agency of this state or another state or country is excepted from public release. Gov't Code § 552.130(a). You claim the submitted video recordings must be withheld under section 552.130 of the Government Code. Upon review, we find one of the video recordings contains information subject to section 552.130. You state the city lacks the technological capability to redact the motor vehicle record information in the video recordings. Accordingly, the city must withhold the video recording we have indicated in its entirety under section 552.130. *See* Open Records Decision No. 364 (1983). However, we find the remaining video recording does not contain any discernible information that is subject to section 552.130. As such, the city may not withhold the

remaining video recording on that basis. As you raise no further exceptions to disclosure, the city must release the remaining video recording.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
