Dear Mr. Meitler:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 561822 (TEA PIR# 23726, 23792).

The Texas Education Agency (the "agency") received two requests from the same requestor for information pertaining to La Marque Independent School District's request for an informal record review. The agency claims the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.116 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception the agency claims and reviewed the submitted representative sample of information.¹

Section 552.116 of the Government Code provides the following:

- (a) An audit working paper of an audit of the state auditor or the auditor of a state agency, an institution of higher education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, a county, a municipality, a school district, a hospital district, or a joint board operating under Section 22.074, Transportation Code, including any audit relating to the criminal history background check of a public school employee, is excepted from [required

public disclosure]. If information in an audit working paper is also maintained in another record, that other record is not excepted from [public disclosure] by this section.

(b) In this section:

(1) "Audit" means an audit authorized or required by a statute of this state or the United States, the charter or an ordinance of a municipality, an order of the commissioners court of a county, the bylaws adopted by or other action of the governing board of a hospital district, a resolution or other action of a board of trustees of a school district, including an audit by the district relating to the criminal history background check of a public school employee, or a resolution or other action of a joint board described by Subsection (a) and includes an investigation.

(2) "Audit working paper" includes all information, documentary or otherwise, prepared or maintained in conducting an audit or preparing an audit report, including:

(A) intra-agency and interagency communications; and

(B) drafts of the audit report or portions of those drafts.

Gov't Code § 552.116. The agency states the submitted information consists of audit working papers prepared or maintained by the agency's Division of Complaints, Investigations, and Enforcement in conjunction with a pending audit of La Marque Independent School District. The agency explains this audit is authorized by sections 39.051 and 39.052 of the Education Code. *See* Educ. Code § 39.051 (commissioner of education by rule shall determine criteria for accreditation statuses of accredited, accredited-warned, and accredited probation); *see also id.* §§ 39.052(a), (b)(1)-(2) (commissioner of education shall annually determine accreditation status of school districts and shall assign accreditation status or revoke accreditation and order closure of district), .102 (setting forth actions to be taken by commissioner of education if district does not satisfy accreditation criteria under section 39.052). Upon review, we agree section 552.116 is applicable in this instance. Therefore, the agency may withhold the submitted information under section 552.116 of the Government Code.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.
