Dear Ms. Mares:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 585849.

The Little Elm Police Department (the "department"), which you represent, received a request for information pertaining to a specified incident involving the requestor. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under sections 552.101 and 552.108 of the Government Code. We have considered the exceptions you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

We note the submitted information was the subject of a previous request for information, in response to which this office issued Open Records Letter No. 2015-21731 (2015). In Open Records Letter No. 2015-21731, we determined the department must withhold the information at issue under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 58.007 of the Family Code. We have no indication the law, facts, or circumstances on which the prior ruling was based have changed. Accordingly, the department must continue to rely on Open Records Letter No. 2015-21731 as a previous determination and withhold the submitted information in accordance with that ruling.¹ See Open Records Decision No. 673 at 6-7 (2001) (discussing criteria for first type of previous determination).

¹As we are able to make this determination, we need not address your arguments against disclosure of this information.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
