Dear Ms. Gonzalez:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 588610.

The Baylor University Police Department (the "department"), which you represent, received a request for the salary and contract of the department police chief. You state you do not have information responsive to a portion of the request.¹ You claim the submitted information is not subject to release under the Act. We have considered your argument and reviewed the submitted information.

We note the 84th Legislature added section 51.212(f) of the Education Code, which reads as follows:

(f) A campus police department of a private institution of higher education is a law enforcement agency and a governmental body for purposes of [the Act], only with respect to information relating solely to law enforcement activities.


¹The Act does not require a governmental body to release information that did not exist when a request for information was received or to prepare new information in response to a request. *See Econ. Opportunities Dev. Corp. v. Bustamante*, 562 S.W.2d 266, 267-68 (Tex. Civ. App.—San Antonio 1978, writ dismissed); Open Records Decision Nos. 605 at 2 (1992), 452 at 3 (1986), 362 at 2 (1983).

Educ. Code § 51.212(f). You inform us the department is a campus police department of a private institution of higher education. *See id.* §§ 51.212(e), 61.003. Thus, you acknowledge the department is a governmental body for purposes of the Act, and information maintained by the department is subject to disclosure under the Act, to the extent such information relates solely to law enforcement activities. You state the submitted information is maintained by the department. However, you argue the submitted information does not relate “solely to law enforcement activities.” Rather, you argue the information consists of administrative documents held by the department. Upon review, we agree the information is administrative in nature and does not relate solely to law enforcement activities. *See id.* Accordingly, we find the submitted information is not subject to disclosure pursuant to section 51.212(f) of the Education Code, and need not be released to the requestor.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
