Re: Request for the audio/video from beginning to end, starting odometer reading at time of dispatch, the ending odometer reading when patrolman cleared the scene, all audio recordings from dispatch to patrolman, all screen shots from patrolman's laptop from DVS, VIN of vehicle at CFS, plate no. of vehicle at CFS, the name of second patrolman who cruised through the scene including badge number, plate no. of second vehicle, VIN of second vehicle, unit no. of first and second vehicle, odometer reading from second vehicle from the start of his way to scene and ending odometer reading when he left the scene

Dear Mr. Hayes:

The Office of the Attorney General has received your request for a ruling and assigned your request ID# 616432.

After reviewing your arguments and the submitted information, we have determined your request does not present a novel or complex issue. Thus, we are addressing your claims in a memorandum opinion. You claim the video recording must be withheld from the requestor in its entirety pursuant to section 552.130 of the Government Code because you lack the technological capability to redact the motor vehicle record information not pertaining to the requestor from the recording. Thus, we agree you must withhold the video recording in accordance with section 552.130 of the Government Code.
