Victoria Bongat singled out as region's top attorney for dedication to Texas children

Temple – The Office of the Attorney General recognized Victoria Bongat, an Assistant Attorney General (AAG) in the Child Support Division's Temple office, for her commitment to Texas children. Bongat was named Assistant Attorney General of the Year for the Child Support Division's Region 7. She was presented with the award on Wednesday, July 26, 2023, at the Statewide Assistant Attorneys General Conference.

"I am honored to commend Victoria for her unwavering commitment and tireless efforts in support of Texas children and families," Angela Colmenero, Provisional Attorney General said. "Her approach exemplifies the best of public service and is an inspiration to us all. I extend my heartfelt gratitude to Victoria for selflessly answering the call to serve the people of Texas."

One Assistant Attorney General was selected for this honor from each of the state's ten child support field regions, along with an Assistant Attorney General from the Child Support Division State Office in Austin. Honorees are chosen based upon recommendations from their peers and supervisors, with a particular focus on employees who are willing to go beyond their normal duties to serve Texas children. Each recipient demonstrates a desire to serve Texas families, help their colleagues and enhance the Attorney General's Child Support Division.

Bongat, who joined the Office of the Attorney General in 2018, represents the State of Texas in legal actions to establish paternity between children of unmarried parents and their biological fathers. She also works to establish, enforce, and modify court orders that require parents to provide child support, medical support and dental support.

A graduate of St. Mary's University School of Law, Bongat was chosen to be the region's Assistant Attorney General of the Year for being an exemplary attorney, willing trainer and a strong leader. She has demonstrated the willingness to take on any task and provide wise legal direction to her co-workers. She has earned the reputation as a reliable leader.

"Ms. Bongat is a true and valuable asset to the Child Support Division and the families we serve. She is always one of the first to volunteer, whether it is helping a colleague who is out or behind, assisting another office with docket, or presenting for regional and statewide meetings for AAGs.
