RE: Texas Legislature Passage of Senate Bill 602

Dear Secretary Mayorkas:

We write to notify you that the 88th Texas Legislature has passed, and Governor Abbott has signed into law Senate Bill 602 expanding the law enforcement authority of federal border patrol agents.¹ Please find a copy of that legislation attached. The law now provides that upon completion of a training conducted by the Texas Department of Public Safety, a Border Patrol Agent of the United States Customs and Border Protection has the powers of arrest and search and seizure as to any felony offenses under Texas law if the arrest, search, or seizure (1) occurs on the premises of a port facility or at a border patrol traffic checkpoint, and (2) is incident to a detainment under federal law.²

Additionally, Senate Bill 602 requires the Texas Attorney General to notify the "commanding authority of each United States border patrol sector" in Texas regarding the authority granted to border patrol agents under the Act, and of the circumstances under which it may be exercised. I request that you forward this letter and the enclosed legislation to the respective commanding authorities. In the alternative, please provide a list of those commanding authorities so that our office may provide such notification directly.

Texas has been forced to develop new solutions after the federal government abdicated enforcement and even weaponized immigration law to intensify surges of new arrivals at the border. Senate Bill 602 reflects Texans' desire for a more robust and effective response to the historic levels of unvetted foreign aliens entering our state. By augmenting the authority of our federal law enforcement partners, we invite your increased assistance in securing the border and defending our citizens. I look forward to your full cooperation in this matter.

| 5 | SECTION 1. Article 2.122, Code of Criminal Procedure, is |

| 7 | (c-1) In addition to the power granted under Subsection (c), |

(b) The department may enter into a written agreement with
the United States Customs and Border Protection for purposes of
providing the training program developed under this section.

7 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date 8 of this Act, the office of the attorney general shall give written 9 notice to the commanding authority of each United States border 10 patrol sector in this state regarding the authority granted to 11 border patrol agents by this Act and the circumstances under which 12 this authority may be exercised.

13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
