RE: Request for Interpretation of the Texas Structural Pest Control Act Article 135b-6.

Dear Attorney General Cornyn:

Pursuant to Government Code §402.042, the Structural Pest Control Board (SPCB) requests an Opinion as to the interpretation of one of the Sections of V.A.T.S., Article 135b-6.

Consumers are increasingly turning to the Board for assistance in resolving contractual issues between licensee and the consumer. This increasing consumer concern has led the Structural Pest Control Board members to seek an Opinion from your office after the Board's last meeting held on July 20, 2000. The motion to seek the opinion of your office passed unanimously.

- May the Board regulate contract language? V.A.T.S. Article 135b-6 §2(a)(3) defines persons engaged in structural pest control entering into contracts. V.A.T.S., Article 135b-6 §4(h) talks about a statement of jurisdiction being printed on every contract. V.A.T.S., Article 135b-6 §4F(b)(1) talks about printing a method to contact the Board on every contract. These sections talk about contracts. However, the Act itself is silent as to whether the Board may require regulatory language to be a part of every contract.
- 2. Does the Act give the Board authority to enter into contract enforcement? As previously mentioned, nothing in the Act addresses contract enforcement. Consumers increasingly are asking the Board for assistance in this area.
