Re: Constable precinct boundary lines

Dear General Abbott:

We request your opinion regarding the following questions:

- 1. Do constable precinct boundary lines have significance, other than to serve as divisions within the county for political and budgetary purposes?
- 2. Are there law enforcement services that a constable may perform only within his defined precinct and not within the boundaries of another constable precinct of the same county?
- 3. To what extent may a constable "police and patrol," as a peace officer, in a constable precinct other than his own?
- 4. May a constable, pursuant to an interlocal agreement between the county and the school district, provide police services to a school district that is within the same county, where a portion of the school district lies outside his precinct but within the geographic boundaries of a neighboring constable's precinct? Would it matter if the constable who is not providing such services objects to another constable providing such services within the precinct in which the objecting constable serves?
- 5. May two adjoining counties enter into an interlocal agreement for one of the counties to provide law enforcement services on a toll road that transgresses both counties' geographic boundaries? If so, must the sheriff or other law enforcement official of the county receiving the services from the providing county agree to the provision of services by the other county?
